

WHAT IS A *Codicil*?

A codicil is an amendment to an existing Will. A Codicil is intended to make a small change to your Will that does not affect the overall structure of your estate plan.

**For example, if you wish to add or increase a legacy gift for
The Scarborough Hospital Foundation in your existing Will, you may simply make a Codicil.**

A Codicil is a Simple Document

There may be no need to spend extra time or money to create a new Will in order to add or increase a legacy gift to The Scarborough Hospital Foundation. Instead, your wishes to benefit The Scarborough Hospital Foundation may be fulfilled by simply having a Codicil, which will be kept with your Will, and may include wording similar to the following:

*I give the sum of \$_____ to The Scarborough Hospital Foundation
(charitable registration number 11914 2263 RR0001), 3030 Lawrence Ave. E., Suite 108,
Scarborough, ON M1P 2T7, to be used for the highest priorities as determined by the
Board of Directors of The Scarborough Hospital Foundation.*

Is a Lawyer Required to Prepare Your Codicil?

While a lawyer is not legally required for you to have a Codicil drafted, reviewed, or executed, it is nevertheless in your best interests to do so. There are legal requirements and formalities that must be followed for a Codicil to be valid and to ensure that it does not inadvertently revoke your existing Will. The Codicil is typically one to two pages in length; therefore, it is relatively less costly and easier to complete than a Will.
